### POLITICAL GROUPS AND THE MINISTRIES OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS AND LABOUR GET INVOLVED IN UNLOCKING OUR COLLECTIVE AGREEMENT

May 18th, 2022

As we have been informing, **CCOO** and **UGT** have get in touch with different Organisms and Institutions to let them know that the blockage of our collective agreement is of great importance, especially in a context of historical inflation data and a new labour legislation. These have been the progress so far:

- **UGT** and **CCOO** held a meeting on April 26th with the **General Directorate of Labor (DGT)** to request their mediation. Finally, after holding conversations during the last few weeks, the DGT has summoned the members of the negotiating table on May 24th.
- On May 10<sup>th</sup> we met with **Unidas Podemos parliamentary group**, who showed their support to our mobilizations by joining the workers in the streets on the 13th.
- Tomorrow, May 19th, we will meet with the **ERC parliamentary group**, to whom we will inform about the situation
- For its part, the **Ministry of Consumer Affairs** has called both unions for a meeting on next May 23rd, where we will communicate them the precariousness in which care services to users and consumers are provided.
- Finally, the **Socialist Party Parliamentary Group** has also summoned **UGT y CCOO** on May 24th, a meeting we will attend with the aim of add supports in putting an end to this conflict, that lasts already for 29 months.

From **CCOO** and **UGT** we will continue contacting Institutions y Organisms who could contribute with alternative ways of dialogue to unlock this negotiation.

In the meantime, we maintain **the 24-hours strike** call for **June 13<sup>th</sup>**.
